

ALPHA ARCHITECT IMPLEMENTS A FASTER REBALANCE CADENCE AND FLEXIBLE TRADING

Havertown, PA— October 1, 2023 —<u>Alpha Architect</u> is pleased to announce that their focused factor ETFs will shift from a quarterly rebalance cycle to a monthly rebalance cycle.

Effective 10/1/2023, the following Alpha Architect ETFs will be affected:

- <u>Alpha Architect U.S. Quantitative Value ETF</u> (Ticker: QVAL)
- <u>Alpha Architect U.S. Quantitative Momentum ETF</u> (Ticker: QMOM)
- <u>Alpha Architect International Quantitative Value ETF</u> (Ticker: IVAL)
- <u>Alpha Architect International Quantitative Momentum ETF</u> (Ticker: IMOM)

In addition to a more frequent rebalancing frequency, the firm will implement an upgraded trade optimization system that seeks to maximize portfolio returns net of projected frictional costs. The model was designed via a collaboration among the firm's three research Ph.Ds – Wes Gray, Jack Vogel, and Josh Russell.

Founder Wes Gray, Ph.D., continues:

"We have always sought to deliver the best after-fee, after-tax factor exposures possible. The ETF wrapper helps us minimize tax drag, and our extensive experience and research related to trading equities has allowed us to move to a more frequent rebalancing platform while minimizing cost impacts on the portfolio."

Dr. Jack Vogel, CIO of Alpha Architect, highlights why the team is excited about the new capability:

"We've always known that higher frequency rebalance can lead to better outcomes for factor funds. This is especially true for momentum strategies, but also relevant to value strategies. We started with quarterly but now feel confident we can move to a monthly rebalance frequency and still capture expected returns net of frictional costs."
