

## From Silicon Valley to Taiwan to Wall Street New York Taiwanese Chamber of Commerce Press Release 2024.07.03

Draco Group will also celebrate its first ETF listing with a bell-ringing ceremony at the New York Stock Exchange on July 12, offering new investment choices to investors.

Forum moderators will invite guests to share their entrepreneurial experiences in Silicon Valley and Taiwan, discussing why they aim to bring Taiwan's AI and investment achievements to the U.S. capital markets.

Ambassador Kuang-Chang Lee of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in New York will deliver a speech. The economic section of the office will also introduce the Employment Gold Card and Entrepreneur Visa, encouraging U.S. professionals to start businesses and seek employment in Taiwan.
